



YOUR COMPASSION HELPS MORE MOTHERS AND BABIES SURVIVE CHILDBIRTH—

Meet Altinise, a young mom living in a remote, rural area of Crochu, Haiti where hospitals and health clinics are hours away. Immediately after the birth of her baby girl, 23-year-old Altinise was bleeding, shivering, and feeling dizzy. The bleeding continued unabated, much more than what is normal. Something was very wrong. That's when a birth attendant, trained by Medical Teams International, stepped up and put her knowledge to work.

And it just so happened that the birth attendant was Altinise's own mother, Jaqueline. (In Crochu, Haiti, Medical Teams trains and supervises hundreds of birth attendants to monitor and prevent complications arising from complicated births.)

From her eight months of training, Jaqueline knew that Altinise was exhibiting all the warning signs of bleeding at a dangerously high level. So Jaqueline quickly put what she had learned into action to help her daughter. To ease postpartum bleeding, Jaqueline began gently massaging Altinise's abdomen, just above where the uterus is located. She had learned this method to stunt the flow of blood.

She also told Altinise to start breastfeeding. Both tactics are intended to prompt a woman's body to release a hormone that helps keep the uterus intact and stabilizes bleeding.

These were tactics Jaqueline had faith would work. **And they did.**

Soon, the bleeding ceased and Altinise felt well enough to continue breastfeeding her baby.

Your generous donations trained Jaqueline to recognize the warning signs of postpartum bleeding and what to do when she saw them — lessons that saved her daughter's life.



Altinise's story of survival is just one of many lives saved, thanks to your support of our Healthy Children and Safe Motherhood programs.

CHOLERA

The incidence of cholera has decreased from **16% to 0%**

VACCINATION CARDS

Children with vaccination cards has increased from **26% to 51%**

PNEUMONIA

The incidence of pneumonia has decreased from **58% to 31%**

NEONATAL KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge of neonatal danger signs has increased from 40% to 63%

POST NATAL VISITS

Infants receiving a postnatal visit from a trained health worker within two days of birth has increased from **5% to 66%**

VOLUNTEERS MAKE MORE HELP POSSIBLE

Our work is supported by volunteers and leveraged by in-country partners to deliver more health care and more humanitarian aid per donation dollar.

Volunteers generously give their time and expertise to provide disaster response, medical and dental services, health care training, community development, committee and board membership, and distribution center and office support.











Dr. Dale Canfield may be two years retired from his private dental practice, but that doesn't mean he's lost his sense of purpose. Retirement has afforded Dr. Canfield the ability to dedicate his time to serving those in need. In the two years since retirement, Canfield believes he's seen as many patients as he did when he had a private practice. But today, Dr. Canfield provides dental care to disadvantaged populations—people who have neither access to nor resources for a dentist—as a volunteer for Medical Teams' Mobile Dental Program.

A 17-year Medical Teams International volunteer, Dr. Canfield has been on eight trips to Cambodia and has provided care to hundreds of low-income Oregonians. Twice a week, he spends a shift on a Medical Teams Mobile Clinic bus, fixing some of the worst dental destruction he's ever seen. A lot of it is caused by

a general lack of oral hygiene, or too few visits to the dentist. It's rewarding work, he says. When Dr. Canfield walks onto a Mobile Dental van, he knows his help is desperately needed. The words of gratitude at the end of each patient's visit are real and genuine. "It's changed my life," he says.

Dr. Canfield's inspiration comes from his fellow volunteers, who have shown him what can be achieved through dedication and teamwork, serving at home an abroad. He has seen volunteerism manifest itself into tangible change, into lives forever changed.

Dr. Canfield says it is a great feeling to use the accumulated knowledge he learned over a 55-year career to help those in need. Now in his 80s, he's still going strong as a regular fixture at our Mobile Dental Clinics. He plans to continue doing so for as long as he can.

treatment clinics for children in Newberg,
Oregon schools.



Cambia funded Mobile Dental clinics in Oregon and Washington and a field study with 10 Cambia IT employees in Nakivale, Uganda refugee settlement clinics to develop a Health Information Program (HIP) mobile app.

Alaska.

In 2015, Medical Teams International was a beneficiary of Alaska Airline's Charity Miles Program, which provided 2,100,000 donated miles to mobilize employees and volunteers to help the people we serve around the world. Thanks to Alaska Airlines for also donating 80 round-trip airline tickets to Medical Teams Auctions.

Mobile Dental clinics in Oregon and 12 in
Washington, a community health project
in Chicaman, Guatemala--including sending
six community impact teams of Providence
employee volunteers to build latrines and
vented stoves--and an employee volunteer
medical training team.
